Introduction



A Political Road To Martyrdom was conceived, written, and designed as a supplement to The Last Centurion published in 2000. The Last Centurion focused mainly on the man Benito Mussolini and deliberately avoided recording, as far as it was possible, the causes and the details of The Second World War, which brought down the Italian Fascist Party and its Government in 1943. This new publication has no such restrictions as the Fascist Era of Italian History has not been fully or faithfully researched and analyzed to date. The Fascist Regime, which governed Italy from 1922 to 1943, had a profound influence on Italy, its citizens and the world and today remains a salient example of social and political probity, cultural achievements, and national and international programs of wide interest.

This new publication is also a chronicle of the birth and the development of a Global Hierarchy of Regime Changers that did not escape Mussolini's scrutiny and warnings to the nation and to the world. A Political Road To Martyrdom reaches into the murky pasts and the growing global exploits of these Internationalists in today's world of the 21st Century.

In a speech in Milano in 1919 the young revolutionary Benito Mussolini spoke these words:

Today the only way not to live in fear of revolution is to think that we are now in the full swing of one. I am not afraid of the word. I am a revolutionary and a reactionary. I am afraid of the revolution which destroys and does not create. I fear going to extremes, the policy of madness, at the bottom of which may lie the destruction of our fragile mechanical civilization, robbed of its moral basis, and the coming of a terrible race of dominators who would reintroduce discipline into the world and reestablish the necessary hierarchies with the cracking of whips and machine guns.
